Grammar and punctuation is taught in context

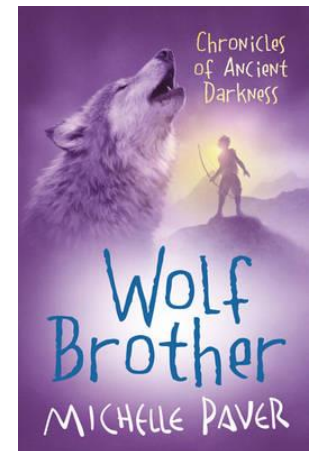

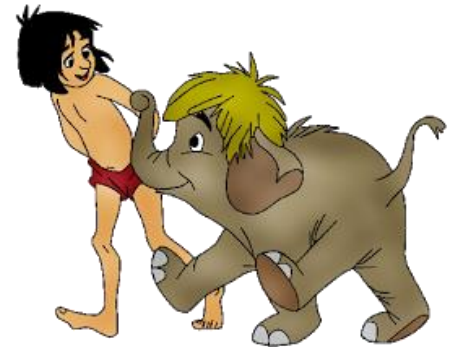
