



# Sunningwell C of E Primary School

## PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY STATEMENT FOR 2020-21

The Pupil Premium (PP) is an element of school funding aimed at raising the attainment of certain disadvantaged groups of pupils. In 2020 predicted funding was calculated on the basis of £1345 for each pupil who has been eligible for free school meals in the past six years, and for looked after children in care for more than six months (5 pupils). There is a related Service Pupil Premium (SP) of £310 for children of families in the armed services (25 pupils).

The funding is provided to schools, which then decide how best to spend this according to local needs. This year our school budget included a total Pupil and Service Premium of £14475 (~3% of our overall revenue budget). Below is a summary of the way we have, and plan, to use this funding to support our pupils' learning.

<p>Children in receipt of Pupil Premium, like many children, are subject to a range of <b>barriers to learning</b>.
