As one of our trained Speak out Stay safe volunteers, you'll help us protect a generation of children from abuse and neglect by visiting schools twice a month to give our age-appropriate Speak out Stay safe workshops.

You'll play a vital role, working alongside other volunteers to make sure children understand the different types of abuse and feel empowered to speak out if they're worried.

As a Speak out. Stay safe. volunteer, you will visit primary schools to deliver Speak out. Stay safe. workshops that teach children about the different types of abuse and how they can speak out and stay safe.

Our Speak out. Stay safe. workshops are age-appropriate and memorable and need an energetic and enthusiastic person to deliver them. You'll work alongside other Speak out. Stay safe. volunteers to make sure at the end of each session the children feel empowered and know who they can speak out to if they are worried.

**Things to consider regarding commitment**

- Training – Online training and 2 days face to face training. You may need to travel for the face to face training.
- Minimum commitment of 2 school visits a month – This roughly equates to between 4 and 8 hours a month
- We ask for an initial commitment of a year because of the cost of recruiting & training volunteers.
- Travel time to and from schools.
- Family commitments.
- Working patterns/shifts.
- Other commitments such as education or training.
